Kentucky	<a href="#">803 KAR 2:180</a>	Kentucky’s reporting requirements are at least as effective as the OSHA requirements and requires that all fatalities and inpatient hospitalizations of three or more workers be reported within 8 hours. Amputations, loss of any eye, and hospitalization of fewer than three workers must be reported within 72 hours. Kentucky also defines amputation and loss of an eye slightly differently than OSHA.	502-564-3070
