

Required Medical Provider Panels by State

Currently, three of FFVA Mutual's licensed states (GA, TN and VA) require that employers provide an injured employee a current and valid panel that includes an approved list of medical providers.

Georgia	FFVA Mutual sends completed panel to policyholder.
	• The panel must consist of at least 6 non-associated physicians but is not limited to a minimum of six.
	 The panel must include an orthopedic physician, a minority physician and no more than 2 physicians from industrial clinics.
	The panel must also be posted at the workplace location.
<u>Indiana</u>	N/A*
<u>Kentucky</u>	N/A*
Mississippi	N/A*
North Carolina	N/A*
South Carolina	N/A*
<u>Tennessee</u>	FFVA Mutual sends completed panel to policyholder.
	 The panel must include at least 3 providers or more, with no more than 4 physicians affiliated in a practice.
	The panel may include 3 physicians.
	Panel must be given to the employee at the time of the injury.
	Upon receipt of a new claim FFVA Mutual also mails a panel to the employee.
Virginia	FFVA Mutual sends completed panel to policyholder.
	 Virginia law requires that an employer offer a panel of at least three physicians to the injured employee for the purpose of providing medical treatment to work related injuries or diseases.
	 If the employer wants to direct care, a panel must be posted.
	 Documentation of the panel offering to the injured employee is important.
	 When filing the first report of injury (FROI), employers should provide a copy of the panel offered to, and signed by the employee.
